Entry Fee: \$10 per entry per class for English and Western Equitation (includes \$5 drug Fee) **Entry Fee:** \$5 per exhibitor for senior showmanship, no entry fee for novice and junior

Limits: Open to Nevada County Junior Exhibitors only. Exhibitor may only bring one horse to show.

- 1. Exhibitor must be age 9 as of January 1, 2019 to enter the division.
- 2. Exhibitors must have proof of ownership or lease available upon request, at check-in time.
- 3. Horse projects must be owned or leased by and under the exhibitor's care and management for 120 consecutive days prior to opening day of Fair. When entering online, both owned and leased horse exhibitors must provide a clear picture of a side view of the horse. Leased animals must also provide a signed lease between owner and member. Owned animals must provide a copy of either registration papers, bill of sale or letter stating the horse was born and raised on their property.
- 4. Junior exhibitors must wear properly strapped headgear in mounted competition. Headgear must be approved by American Society for Testing and Materials / Safety Equipment Institute.
- 5. Junior exhibitors are expected to groom and care for their animal when at Fair. They shall refrain from accepting active assistance from adults and non-exhibiting youth unless the junior exhibitor is actively engaged, and the assistance is only for instruction.
- 6. Junior exhibitors cannot ride or show stallions.
- 7. Exhibitors can either show English Equitation or Western Equitation, but not both.
- 8. Showmanship classes must be pre-entered; however, you must enter an Equitation class to enter showmanship.
- 9. All animals must be serviceably sound. The soundness of animals when determined by the official veterinarian or by the judge shall be final and cannot be protested. The horse show management may request the official veterinarian to examine any animal in competition. Exhibitors who refuse to allow their animal to be examined will be disqualified from showing and will be reported to CDFA. No refunds will be made in these cases. All penalties of the Horse Protection Act of 1970 shall be strictly enforced.
- 10. Equines known to be EIA positive reactors are forbidden to enter, reside, or compete at Fair.
