



## **Online Junior Livestock Show Guidelines**

- To participate in the online show, exhibitors must upload photos and video beginning Friday, July 24 through Monday, August 3.
- The online show is optional and not required to sell in the online auction.
- If an animal is entered in the online show, it must sell in the online auction.
- All exhibitors must complete the [Online Auction Agreement Form](#) (and indicate whether they are participating or not in the auction and show). The form is due by Monday, August 3.
- The online show is for market animals only.
- Market ready determination will not be made as part of the online show.
- Judges will be evaluating all animals in order to select the Market Champions. Animals not selected as Market Champions will not be placed.
- This is a natural show, which means adhesive, glues and paint are not allowed.

## **Online Junior Livestock Auction Information**

- The [Online Auction Agreement Form](#) is due by Monday, August 3.
- Exhibitors must write a short (2-3 sentences) description about their project, and include an estimated weight of their animal (as of August 3), on the [Online Auction Agreement Form](#).
- To participate in the online auction, exhibitors must upload photos and video beginning Friday, July 24 through Monday, August 3. If you've already done this for the online show, you do not need to do these steps again.

- The online auction dates are Thursday, August 13 – Saturday, August 15.
- Animal drop off will be Sunday, August 16 at the Fairgrounds with a schedule as follows:
  - Market Steers – 7 am to 8:30 am
  - Market Goats – 9:30 am to 11:30 am
  - Market Lambs – 9:30 am to 11:30 am
  - Market Rabbits – 1 pm
  - Market Hogs – 5 pm to 8 pm
- When dropping off your animal, you must bring a signed [COVID-19 Release and Waiver of Liability Agreement Form](#) and a signed and completed [Animal Medication and Hormone Use Declaration](#). Every person in the vehicle at the time of drop off must sign and complete a release form.
- Animals will be vet checked and evaluated for market readiness when dropped off following the online auction. Any animal that does not make weight, does not pass the vet check, or is determined not market ready will return home and the sale will be voided.
- Animal market minimum weight:
  - Market Steers – 1,000 lbs.
  - Market Goats - 65 lbs.
  - Market Lambs - 100 lbs.
  - Market Hogs - 200 lbs.
  - Market Rabbits 3.5 – 5.5 lbs. each (Board considering raising the maximum weight to 6.5 lbs.)
- Only one vehicle at a time will be allowed on the grounds to unload.

- If exhibitor does not drop off animal on Sunday, August 16 at the scheduled times, the sale of the animal and the add ons will be voided.

## **Ag Mechanics Auction and Evaluation Information**

- The [Online Auction Agreement Form](#) is due by Monday, August 3.
- To participate in the online Ag Mechanics auction, exhibitors must upload photos beginning Friday, July 24 through Monday, August 3.
- Exhibitors must write a brief (2-3 sentences) description for the project and include a minimum bid for the online auction in the Online Auction Agreement Form, which is due by Monday, August 3.
- Instructions for uploading photos and video are available [here](#).
- Ag Mechanics projects can only be dropped off at Main Street Center (Gate 1) on Wednesday, August 5. Drop off time is by appointment only, and must be coordinated with Kristin at the Fairgrounds Office at 273-6217.
- When dropping off your project, you must bring a signed [COVID-19 Release and Waiver of Liability Agreement Form](#).
- Projects will be evaluated for market readiness on Thursday, August 6. A Best of Show will also be awarded at that time.
- The online auction dates are Thursday, August 13 – Saturday, August 15.
- Buyer collection of Ag Mechanics projects will be scheduled by appointment only on Tuesday, August 18 and Wednesday, August 19.
