





ENTERING YOUR EXHIBITS

Start the Fair season now by entering an exhibit in the Fair! If you can make it, bake it, grow it or show it, we have a category for you. Entering an exhibit is easy and most classes are free to enter. This book has all the information you will need to get started.

To enter an exhibit, you are encouraged to enter online at NevadaCountyFair.com. Printed entry forms can be mailed or dropped off at the Fairgrounds Administration office. Livestock entries may only be completed online.

Online entry forms are due online no later than midnight on Monday, July 15 at NevadaCountyFair.com. Paper

entries are due no later than 4 pm on Monday, July 15 at the Fairgrounds Office on McCourtney Road. For exhibit delivery times and locations please see pages 4 (adult) and 37 (youth). When we receive your Fair exhibit, we'll add your name to our guest list to receive an invitation via email for two free admission tickets to attend the 6:30 pm performance of the Draft Horse Classic, Thursday, September 19.



HOW'S IT JUDGED?

Exhibits are judged by either the Danish or the American judging system.

In the Danish system, each exhibit is judged according to how well it meets a product standard rather than how it compares with other exhibits.

In the American judging system, each entry in a class is judged in comparison to other entries in the class. Awards are given according to relative merit with the potential for no more than one first, one second and one third place per class.

There will be a **Best of Division** award for every "still" division judged American. It will be chosen from entries that receive first place in their

classes. Every Best of Division winner will receive a rosette and/or a sponsored award.

There will be a **Proud Tradition award** for each department. It will be chosen from all the entries that receive Best of Division in the department. The winning exhibitor will receive a \$50 premium and a rosette.

People's Choice award will be voted on by the public for entries in each building. The winning exhibitor will receive a \$50 premium and a rosette.

State rules for California Fairs apply to all competitive exhibits conducted by District and County Fairs in California (cdfa.ca.gov/fe).

- The quality desired in agricultural and horticultural exhibits is the quality that brings the financial return in the commercial market.
- Such Exhibits must be at least equal in maturity to the state of ripeness required by Section 42513 of the California Food & Agricultural Code in order to be considered for premium awards. Section 42513 "Mature" means having reached that stage of ripeness which will ensure the completion of the ripening process to a degree which will ensure palatability, after the removal of the product from the tree, plant or vine. Section 41515 "Over-ripe" means having reached an advanced state of maturity which causes the product to be undesirable for human consumption, in a fresh state.
- Exhibits showing blemishes which detract from the commercial value of any produce are undesirable and should be avoided.
- Definition of Organically Grown: No synthetically compounded fertilizers, pesticides, insecticides, herbicides, fungicides or growth regulators shall be applied by the grower to the field or area in which the commodity is grown for 12 months prior to seed planting or transplanting, and throughout the entire growing season. Also, no post harvest artificial coloring or synthetically compounded agents shall be used. Exceptions include dormant oil and natural occurring compounds as specified in the "California Organic Food Act of 1979."
- Exhibitor must specify variety or type in classes listed as "any other."
- Uniformity of size is important. Market size unless stated.
- Variety of products must be adequately and correctly labeled.
- Any crop maturing after August 7, 2023, may be entered in the 2024 Fair.
- Please exhibit the number requested in each particular class. For instance, if it asks for three ears of corn, bring no more or no less.
- Spoiled entries will be disposed of.



- Informational label to be provided by exhibitor and no larger than 1" x 2 %". It is to be placed on top of tasting jar and not on top of the display jar. Labels must ONLY state name of product, full date canned and method used. Example: WB = water bath, PC = pressure canner. Note: Open kettle items will not be allowed to enter. The exhibitor's name must not be on the label.
- Atmospheric steam canners are allowed for acidic foods.

<u>Quality</u>	<u>Score</u>	<u>Ribbon</u>
1st Place-Superior	90%-100%	Blue
2nd Place-Good	80%-89%	Red
3rd Place-Average	70%-79%	White

- 2. American system will be used for exhibitors over the age of 13. In this system, the exhibits are ranked with only the top few receiving a ribbon. The exhibits are compared directly with each other to choose the best one as first place, second place, third place and so on. Only one ribbon of each color is awarded in each class.
- 3. Best of Division Awards in the Youth Department will only apply to Divisions that are sponsored and that are judged American system.
- 4. Judging **closed** to the general public.

JUNIOR LIVESTOCK AUCTION

SUNDAY, AUGUST 11 AT 9 AM TERMS & CONDITIONS

The Junior Livestock Auction is sponsored and managed by the Nevada County Livestock Producers and the 17th District Agricultural Association.

All Fair rules, both state and local, shall apply to this sale. Exhibitors can show and sell only one market animal, with the exception of exhibitors participating in a small animal project (poultry or rabbit meat pens). These exhibitors may enter a small animal meat pen and one large animal market class. These exhibitors can only sell one project and must declare which animal they will be selling to the Livestock Office as soon as they finish showing their large animal. If the meat pen qualifies as Champion or Reserve Champion, they may not show their large animal in their market class. They will be allowed to show in the large animal showmanship class.

The Junior Livestock Auction is a terminal sale (including small animals). All animals sold at the Junior Livestock Auction, with the exception of small animals, will be sent to federally inspected meat processing plants under the direction of the Nevada County Fair Sale Committee. Small animals will be resale only. All Supreme Champions, Champions and Reserve Champions must sell. It is illegal to tamper with ear tags or sale identification.

Exhibitors of market animals are eligible to show and/or sell in only one county fair, during a calendar year, with the exception of the California State Fair. Exhibitor will be required to sign a certification that they have not sold a market animal at any other county fair (with the exception of the California State Fair) this year.

An exhibitor must be at least nine years of age by January 1st of the current year to sell an animal at the Junior Livestock Auction. For exhibitor age requirements, please refer to the state rules. The exhibitor and animal must be present at the auction and ready to sell when it is his or her turn. If an exhibitor is not present and ready when it is their turn, Fair management has the right to remove the animal from the JLA and, if removed, the animal must be sold resale at the published market price for that species to the harvesting facility designated by the Fairgrounds. Animals that are removed from the JLA for the above reason will not be permitted to leave the Fairgrounds except by the livestock transportation company contracted by the Fairgrounds. Fairgrounds management has the right to grant a variance for those animals that are determined to be unable to sell, due to injury or illness, by the official Fair veterinarian.

When the auctioneer says "SOLD" the animal is sold. However, the exhibitor is responsible for providing feed and water to the animal until it is loaded on the truck, as instructed by the Livestock Superintendent and/or Sale Committee.

Animals must meet weight requirements and be determined market ready by the judge in order to be eligible to sell. The Auctioneer has the final say on all bids. No private treaties are allowed.

A commission to be determined by the Nevada County Fair Board will be charged to promote and finance the sale.

All exhibitors selling in this JLA Auction MUST write thank-you letters to their respective buyers and any buyer who added a "bump" immediately after the Sale and prior to receipt of their check.

LIVESTOCK GENERAL INFORMATION

NEVADA COUNTY FAIR'S UNIFORM REQUIREMENTS

- 1. The official competition uniform of the Nevada County Fair 4-H and Independent Livestock Exhibitors shall consist of: White long pants; white sleeved (long or short) shirt with collar. In addition to the official competition uniform as stated above, 4-H has additional requirements as follow: 4-H Club exhibitors are expected to wear the 4-H tie or scarf and the 4-H Hat branded with the UC ANR and the 4-H clover logo (youth may wear current green hat with only the 4-H clover logo and/or white hat for the remainder of their 4-H career). Poultry and Rabbit exhibitors are to wear long-sleeved shirts.
- 2. The official FFA show uniform shall be worn by all FFA exhibitors and by helpers in individual and chapter groups while showing at fairs and livestock shows. The uniform shall consist of white jeans, white dress shirt or blouse (short or long-sleeved), and the official FFA blue necktie for boys or FFA blue scarf for girls. For the Nevada County Fair the official FFA jacket must be worn. Hats or headgear of any kind shall not be worn with the official show uniform while showing. Agriculture Mechanics project exhibitors, must be in official career development event FFA uniforms; official FFA jacket, zipped to the top, worn with a white, collared dress shirt, and official FFA necktie(boys) or scarf (girls), black slacks/jeans, black socks, and black dress shoes or dress boots.
- 3. The official competition uniform of the <u>Grange</u> Fair Program consists of: white long pants, white long-sleeved button-front dress shirt with collar; the official red waist vest with National Grange emblem on the back. Poultry and Rabbit exhibitors are to wear long-sleeved shirts.

For safety reasons, all exhibitors must wear closed-toed shoes with an enclosed heel while working with livestock.



JUDGING & DEFINITIONS

The Exhibits Department and Fair Management hire quality judges. Score cards are used as a tool by judges. However, all judging is subjective. It is the judge's opinion that day.

MARKET ANIMAL: Any beef, sheep, swine, goat (for large animals) and poultry, rabbit meat pen and turkeys (for small animals) or as categorized by the fair, that are raised for the purpose of becoming food products for consumers.

MARKET READY: A term that defines the amount of fat cover a market animal has and determines if an animal is ready to be harvested, Please refer to State Rule XIII. On pages 33-34 Junior Department. For clarification per specific animal go online to www. cdfa.ca.gov/fairsandexpositions.

Non-Market Ready: Animal lacking evidence of sufficient fat disposition to produce a desirable consumer product.

Limit the grooming and fitting of all animals to the most natural methods. Washing, clipping and brushing are encouraged. No paints, dyes, glues or adhesives allowed. As a water conservation measure, management has the right to limit washing to use of spray bottles. The Show Policies allow:




Washing animal, using soap and water, for cleaning purposes.

Materials used for the health and safety of the animal.

Any signs of altering the natural color of an animal will result in its disqualification. An exhibitor who has an animal disqualified shall have the right to appeal to an appeal panel approved by the Nevada County Fair Board of Directors. If an exhibitor shall disregard these guidelines the management shall have the right to excuse the exhibitor and the animals from competition.

JUNIOR LIVESTOCK AUCTION





- 1. A "Thank You" note(s) must be written to each buyer & each "bump up" received for your animal.
- 2. A "Thank You" note(s) must be written to each award sponsor if you received awards that were sponsored through the fair.
- Standard stationery designed for correspondence or large size greeting cards (blank inside) must be used **DO NOT USE**: binder paper (lined paper of any kind) plain printer and index cards.
- 4. Thank you must be written in ink or typed. If typed they should be signed in your own penmanship.
- 5. Envelope must be properly addressed (in ink) with complete name and address of buyer and award sponsors and stamped, before you can receive your check. The Fair will not supply material or stamps for your use. Envelope must have your complete return address and lot number.
- Your "Thank You" note(s) must be delivered to the Fairgrounds administration office in order to receive your auction checks or premium checks.



LOCAL RULES

EXHIBITORS MUST FAMILIARIZE THEMSELVES WITH THE RULES, AS THEY WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.

The following are the local rules for the 17th District Agricultural Association, Nevada County Fair. Variances to these rules may only be granted by the Board of Directors of the 17th District Agricultural Association. Variance requests must be made in writing to: Nevada County Fair (17th District Agricultural Association) 11228 McCourtney Road, Grass Valley, CA 95949 or may be delivered to the Administration Office at Gate 1, 11228 McCourtney Road, Grass Valley, CA.

General Rules

- 1. The Board of Directors of the 17th District Agricultural Association, Nevada County Fair, will be the final authority in any decisions or disputes involving the Fair or the Fairgrounds.
- 2. The Nevada County Fairgrounds does not allow smoking during the Fair on the Fairgrounds, except in designated outdoor smoking areas. Those who desire to smoke, MUST visit one of the five designated smoking areas.
- 3. No vehicles or trailers will be permitted on the inner grounds during the five days of the Fair without a signed permit from the Fair Management.
- 4. No dogs or pets are allowed on the inner grounds during the annual Fair, Draft Horse Classic or Country Christmas Faire except for service animals. A service animal is any animal trained to do work or perform tasks for the benefit of an individual with a disability. Pets providing emotional support, well-being, comfort or companionship are not recognized as service animals under ADA regulations and are not permitted at this event.
- 5. Camping sites are limited and assigned by Fair Management. Livestock exhibitor camping is limited to livestock exhibitors that need to stay for the duration of the Fair. No Junior livestock exhibitor shall be allowed to stay on the Fairgrounds without a chaperone. Camping chaperone must be 25 years of age or older. There must be at least one chaperone for every three youths camping.
- 6. Livestock trailers must be removed from the Fairgrounds the day of unloading the animals. Exceptions are for those exhibitors who are open exhibitors or are showing breeding animals.
- 7. Substitutions can only be made within a division.
 Substitutions must be made when the exhibit arrives at the Fairgrounds; or for animals when registration certificates are checked. In the livestock department a \$5 penalty must be paid for each substitution made by the exhibitor in excess of two in the division.
- 8. Designated entry fees must accompany entry forms. Entry fees are non-refundable. Checks that are returned for NON-SUFFICIENT FUNDS for any payments to the Nevada County Fair (entries, passes, auction, etc.) are subject to a \$30 fee for each check.

Late Still Entries

9. Still exhibit late entries will be accepted no later than

5 pm on the Friday immediately following the published entry deadline. A late fee of \$10 per item will be charged. Late entries will not be considered after this deadline. Ag Mechanics late entries will be accepted no later than 5 pm on the Friday immediately following the published entry deadline. A \$50 per item late fee will be added to the entry.

Exhibits

- 10. In the case of limited exhibit space, exhibiting preference will be given to: 1) Nevada County youth exhibitors, 2) Nevada County adult exhibitors, 3) exhibitors from Sierra, Placer and Yuba counties, 4) exhibitors from all other California counties and 5) exhibitors from adjacent states. Legal residency shall be the determining factor. A final decision of acceptance or rejection of any exhibit will be at the discretion of Fair Management.
- 11. A Nevada County Youth exhibitor is defined as an exhibitor who meets the eligibility and age requirements as defined within the State Rules and whose legal residence is within the boundaries of the 17th District Agricultural Association (Nevada County) or who attends a Nevada County school and is a member of the FFA, Nevada County 4-H or Nevada County Grange. Refer to State Rule VII.1-20 Junior Department.
- 12. Exhibitors age on January 1 shall be maintained through the calendar year.
- 13. Exhibits not in place at the time specified will not be permitted to compete for premiums and no entry fees will be refunded.
- 14. Exhibits must be picked up Tuesday, August 13, 2024 between 1 pm and 6 pm unless otherwise noted. Exhibit claim tags must be presented when claiming exhibits.
- 15. Perishables not claimed by 6 pm Tuesday, August 13, 2024 will be disposed of unless other arrangements have been made.
- 16. All items will be judged, but may not be displayed.
- 17. Premiums, trophies and ribbon awards are offered as an inducement to increase competition. Where there is no competition (i.e. no entries or one entry) for two years or more, the Fair Board may remove the class from the Competition Handbook. By the same token, if there are assurances that there will be sufficient competition for a class not already in the book or for one that has been previously deleted, The Fair Board may add them to the Competition Handbook. Such requests must be made in writing to the above address.
- 18. Should a premium be found to have been obtained by false evidence, misrepresentation or a violation of any of the State or Local Rules, the premium award will be withheld.
- 19. Exhibitors, excluding livestock, are required to remove all labels, signs or traces of ownership from any exhibit before being presented for judging, with the exception of the exhibit tag which will be given to the exhibitor at the time of submitting exhibit.
- 20. No "For Sale" signs are to be posted at or near any exhibit for the duration of the Fair. This rule applies to both still

- and livestock exhibits. No private treaties allowed on the Fairgrounds.
- 21. Any failure by an exhibitor to keep an exhibit fresh, clean and attractive, which is not in the best interest of the Fair, endangers the public, or fails to comply with the rules and regulations set forth in this Competition Handbook will, at the discretion of Fair Management, result in forfeiture of any premiums which may have been won by that exhibitor and possibly the immediate removal of the entry in question from the Fairgrounds.
- 22. Inappropriate, unethical, or inimical behavior on the part of exhibitors, leaders, advisors, or parents may result in forfeiture of any awards and/or privileges on the premises of the 17th District Agricultural Association.
- 23. Protests will be considered only if there has been a violation of State or Local Rules that has not been enforced. Decisions of judges, veterinarians, weigh masters, breed callers, tail dock official and times cannot be protested and are final. To file a protest, it must be in writing within 24 hours of the time of the cause of protest and accompanied by a deposit of \$500.00. For more information, see the State Rules for California Fairs.

Late Livestock Entries

24. Market and breeding animal late entries will be accepted no later than 5 p.m. on the Friday immediately following the published entry deadline. A late fee of \$50 per animal will be added to the entry fee. The applicable ownership rules, as detailed in the State Rules for California Fairs, still apply and must be verified by Fairgrounds staff for all late entries. Late entries for Pee Wee, Novice, Junior and Senior Showmanship classes will be accepted up until 3 pm on the Tuesday of the week of the Fair. A late fee of \$25 will be added to the entry fee and must be paid at the time the class is added. Late showmanship entries will not be accepted after this deadline.

Livestock

- 25. **Back-up Market Animal(s):** An exhibitor may enter up to two back-up animals.
 - Back-up animals may be different species, although a large animal back-up must be a large animal species and a small animal back-up must be a small animal species.
 - A back-up animal may not be simultaneously entered as a breeding animal.

26. Family Back-up Market Animal

- A Family Back-up Animal is a back-up market animal that is shared by immediate family members.
- A Family Back-up Animal can only be shared by immediate family members who reside in the same household and share in the responsibility of raising and caring for the back-up animal. Each family member using the same family back-up animal must properly enter and pay the appropriate entry fee prior to the entry deadline.
- A Family Back-up Animal may only be weighed in and shown by a single family member at the Fair.
- 27. **In order to participate in a youth livestock program** (excluding horse & dogs) at any California Fair, all exhibitors

- 9 years of age and older must obtain annual certification in the Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) program approved by the California Department of Food and Agriculture, Fairs and Expositions Branch. Those not certified are not eligible to participate at a California Fair, including the Nevada County Fair.
- 28. See page 83 for uniform requirements.
- 29. Youth exhibitors (4-H, Grange, FFA and Independent) entering a market animal must participate in the mandatory entry process and provide proof of ownership.
- 30. Animals that are not entered in the Fair are not allowed to be on the grounds during the Fair at any time.
- 31. Bordering county exhibitors may not show and sell a market animal at the Nevada County Fair unless they meet the requirements and definition of a Nevada County Youth exhibitor. (See Local Rule No. 11 above.)
- 32. Open livestock will not be accepted before Monday, August 5 at 1 pm and must be in place, with papers checked by Tuesday, August 6, 2024 by 4 pm.
- 33. Unless otherwise noted, entry preference will be given based upon available space to: Nevada County Junior Exhibitors; Nevada County Senior Exhibitors; Exhibitors from Placer, Sierra, and Yuba counties; all other California counties. Legal residency shall be the determining factor.
- 34. The scales to be unlocked by the Livestock Superintendent for specific weigh-in times. Tuesday, August 6, 2024 will be the official weigh-in day, scheduled as follows:

Swine	8 am to 10 am
Beef	11 am to 12 pm
Sheep	1 pm to 2 pm
Goats	2 pm to 3 pm
	owing poultry health check-in

- 35. Animals must be clean of mud before crossing the scales. Exhibitors with backup animals can weigh up to three animals (their market entry and up to two back-up animals) on the official weigh-in day. If the market and back-up animals are the same species, the exhibitor must declare which animal will be shown to the Livestock Superintendent within the published weigh-in period for that species. If the exhibitor has multiple market species entered, the exhibitor must declare which animal they will be showing following the conclusion of the weigh period for the last species weighed. The non-show animal(s) must be removed from the Fairgrounds by 8 pm on weigh in day.
- 36. Reweigh Procedure: Reweighing of market animals will only be allowed when the first weight recorded is below minimum or above maximum and results in the animal being sifted. The exhibitor must indicate to the Livestock Superintendent immediately after the initial weight that they request a reweigh. The animal must remain in the immediate scale area in view of the Livestock Superintendent. The scale will be zeroed and the animal weighed again. The second weight becomes the official weight. If the animal is removed from the immediate scale area and then returned to the scale for a reweigh, no reweigh will be allowed.

LOCAL RULES

- 37. Animals that do not meet market weight requirements will be sifted from the Junior Livestock Auction. State Rule: If the exhibitor has a market animal that is below sifted weight and as a result may not show in an individual market class, the exhibitor may use this animal for showmanship only if this animal is the only animal the exhibitor has brought to the fair. Otherwise, sifted animals must be removed from the Fairgrounds.
- 38. Junior livestock exhibitors of large and small animals must attend the orientation meeting on Tuesday, August 6 2024 at 6:30 pm in the Whitney Pavilion.
- 39. Exhibitors of all barns/species are responsible to organize their own barn duty schedules.
- 40. Junior livestock exhibitors must show their animal before the animal can be sold at the Junior Livestock Auction.
- 41. No animal will leave the Fairgrounds before Sunday, August 11, 2024 until 8 pm. Fairgrounds Management may designate a later time, if deemed necessary, to ensure public safety.
- 42. All animals must be off the Fairgrounds by 12 pm (noon) Monday, August 12 2024
- 43. The exercise area for all animals will be designated by the Livestock Superintendent.
- 44. Each exhibitor is responsible for providing and caring for their own feed and bedding for large animals.
- 45. Completed stall cards must be hung over the livestock during the Fair. If a card is damaged for any reason, it is the responsibility of the exhibitor to see that it is replaced immediately. Stall cards are available at the Livestock Office.

- 46. All Supreme Champions, Reserve Supreme Champions, Champions and Reserve Champions must sell in all large and small market species.
- 47. Nursing cows will not be permitted on the Fairgrounds. This rule does not apply to natural mothers.
- 48. Any services, including treatment and medication, provided by the veterinarian on the Fairgrounds will be paid for by the exhibitor. Check with the Livestock Office for the on-call veterinarian.
- 49. It is imperative that the owner of an animal, or a responsible agent, be available at all times the animal is present on the grounds to make any and all decisions concerning the welfare of said animal. Contact information must be provided at the time of entry.

Signs

- 50. Exhibitors may not display signs of a commercial nature that advertise feed, supplements, equipment, etc.
- 51. Exhibitors wishing to hang signs over 16" x 36" must obtain written permission from Fair Management.
- 52. Exhibitor's signs will be restricted to the exhibitor's stall area. See Rules 20 and 21 in Exhibits section on pages 84 and 85.
